

7/8 CORNWALL CENTRAL SUMMER SCHOOL 2024

General Information and Student Handbook

Program Eligibility: Students in the Cornwall Central School District, grades 7 & 8, who have been identified as being in need of remedial services due to low academic performance will be offered a Summer School program. This will be a program for students who have achieved limited success during the 2023-2024 school year. Instructors will use Google classroom in conjunction with classroom instruction.

Student Eligibility: Cornwall Central students grades 7 and 8 who earned an unsatisfactory grade in a core course during the school year and have been recommended by the Cornwall Middle School counseling center.

Classes Meet: JULY 15 — AUGUST 1, Monday - Thursday, 7:15 - 11:55 AM
(For more detail, see schedule below)

Before you can register: Students who are eligible must have been in contact with their school counselor for approval. All registration and course schedules will be available through the district website. ONLY Cornwall students who have been identified by the school can register. Students will be contacted by the Cornwall Middle School.

Registration: All students who are eligible will receive a notification from the Middle School. Once notification has been received, students who wish to register for 7/8 Summer School courses can do so with the Google Summer School registration process located at the Cornwall Central School District's website: www.cornwallschools.com. Registration will open June 24th on the School's website. The registration deadline is June 30th. 7th and 8th grade students who register for middle school summer school will be assigned three classes: Math, ELA and Skills.

The Cornwall School District reserves the right to cancel courses or change the class schedule due to insufficient enrollment or lack of instructors. Once your registration has been processed, you will receive an informational email. **Students wishing to take Spanish I in summer school must register in person on June 27 or 28th at the Cornwall Central High School, 10 Dragon Drive, New Windsor, NY, 8:00 AM - 12:00 PM.**

Program Information: The 7/8 summer school program will operate at the Cornwall Central High School, 10 Dragon Drive, New Windsor, NY. Students are expected to arrive on-time, seated in their classroom at the start of class. Transportation WILL be provided for students if desired. Students are expected to attend the entire day.

DATES: July 15 through August 1.

CLASS SCHEDULE: Classes meet Monday – Thursday (NO Friday classes)

CLASS PERIODS:

Period 1:7:15 to 8:45 a.m.

Period 2:8:50 to 10:20 a.m.

Period 3:10:25 to 11:55 a.m.

TRANSPORTATION: Students in the 7/8 summer school program are eligible to receive free transportation to and from the Cornwall Central High School from anywhere within the Cornwall Central School District. Parents will indicate that transportation is desired when registering.

CURRICULUM

The material covered in all remedial courses will be based upon New York State syllabi, Common Core standards, and study skills and practices that will benefit the student and are determined to improve academic performance. Skills classes will focus on developing the academic skills of the students to improve performance across all curricula.

GRADES

- A. All progress will be reported by individual teachers upon request.
- B. Students will take a STAR Assessment in Math and Reading at the beginning and the end to assess progress.
- C. Final reports indicating a pass or fail status for each class as well as STAR Assessment results will be emailed to parents and the Middle School at the end of the program.
- D. Success will be based on classwork and participation.
- E. Students are expected to follow each teacher's course expectation outline. Teachers will determine and publish the expectations for their individual classrooms.
- F. Students are expected to maintain high academic integrity throughout the summer. Incidents of cheating or plagiarism WILL NOT be tolerated. Students will receive a zero on any assignment or assessment where cheating or plagiarism has occurred. A second offense may result in dismissal from this program.

ACCEPTABLE USE OF COMPUTERIZED INFORMATION RESOURCES: Throughout the duration of the Cornwall Summer School program, students are required to conduct themselves in an appropriate manner. This is especially true with regards to use of various computer devices. The reason for using an internet service for educational purposes is to support scholarly research and to engage in class-related activities. This also includes participating in virtual lessons as well as all related assignments, quizzes and tests. Each student is expected to maintain the highest degree of decorum. By registering for a summer class, both the student and parents acknowledge that the proper equipment and internet service is available for remote learning.

With the privileges and rights of an Internet user in an educational setting come certain responsibilities and regulations that include, but are not limited to:

1. Avoiding inappropriate sites
2. Complying with copyright laws
3. Appropriate communication/behavior via the Internet
4. Respecting the classroom environment

Should any regulation or instructor's guideline/direction be violated, access privileges may be revoked and school disciplinary and/or appropriate legal action may be taken.

Inappropriate or unauthorized usage of school equipment or Internet access or violation of any usage agreement with regard to Internet access is prohibited.

Consequences, which may be imposed on students include, but are NOT limited to the following:

1. Warning
2. Temporary loss of email/Google Classroom or other online program access
3. Removal from the program
4. Referral to the appropriate law enforcement agency

DISCIPLINE: All students are expected to follow the Cornwall Central School District's Code of Conduct which can be found on the school district's website; www.cornwallschools.com.

Infractions of the Code of Conduct will result in consequences which will be communicated to the parent or guardian. Consequences, which may be imposed on students include, but are NOT limited to the following:

1. Warning
2. Removal from class
3. Dismissal - While all efforts will be made to remediate behaviors, students may be dismissed from a class or the program for severe or multiple infractions.
4. Referral to the appropriate law enforcement agency

ATTENDANCE / TARDINESS: Students in the 7/8 summer program are expected to attend on a regular basis and are strongly encouraged to attend every class throughout the duration of the program. The following attendance rules and expectations apply to all students.

1. Students are expected to be in their seats at the time class begins.
2. Any tardiness in excess of fifteen (15) minutes will be considered as one full absence.
3. If a student is late to the same class twice, it will be counted as a (1) full absence.
4. Parents are required to email or send in a note regarding any student absence.

Legal Absences include:

- sickness / doctor or health clinic visit
- sickness or death in family
- religious observance
- lack of internet service – this WILL count as an absence
- required to be in court

Please email all notes for an absence to the Summer School Principal, Mr. Keller: mkeller@cornwallschools.com. A note (email) from parent/guardian is required for each tardiness or absence. In the event of accumulated absences resulting in the removal of the student from the program, once parents have been notified, the Middle School counseling center will also be notified.

DROPS: Parents may choose to drop their student from the program. An email to the Summer School Principal should be sent should parents choose to drop their student from the program. Excessive absenteeism will be considered as a drop from the program. Parents and the Middle School will be notified of student drops.
