AN ACT to amend the civil service law, in relation to leave for cancer screening; and repealing certain provisions of such law relating thereto

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The section heading and subdivision 1 of section 159-b of the civil service law, the section heading as amended by chapter 566 of the laws of 2006 and subdivision 1 as amended by chapter 391 of the laws of 2008, are amended to read as follows:

- The provisions of this section shall not apply to any employee of a city having a population of one million or more.
