COURSE DESCRIPTION: This is a survey course covering United States History and Government spanning from the Civil War up to the modern era. We will engage in many different activities to learn more about several key events in our nation's history in a concise amount of time. In this course we will focus on the most important people, places, and events.

REQUIRED TEXTS AND MATERIALS: I will keep all textbooks in the classroom as we will often utilize digital texts. If you would like a copy of the book, I will provide one upon request. If you choose to receive a textbook, you may leave it at home or wherever it is that you complete your homework assignments, just do not lose it!

GRADING: To determine your final grade in the course, I will calculate your percentage by dividing your total earned points by the total points possible. Remember- I do not assign you grades, you earn them! Here are how your grades are broken down throughout the year:

Tests/Projects/Essays: 60%

Quizzes: 30%

Homework/Classwork: 10%

*Note: The failure to complete classwork and homework may not seem as though it will be too detrimental to your grade, but please understand that those assignments are what will best prepare you for the assessments that *will* impact your grade significantly.

ASSIGNMENT SUBMISSION: Assignments are to be handed in on the day they are due, in person, at the start of the class period. If an assignment is due via Google Classroom, it is due online at the designated time period. **If an assignment is handed in with no name (including assessments), <u>10 points</u> will be deducted from the assignment.**

LATE WORK: Late work will be accepted with 50% credit maximum.

TEST CORRECTIONS: Test corrections will not be offered throughout the year unless an individual arrangement is made between the student and myself.

PLAGIARISM/ACADEMIC OFFENSES: Plagiarism will not be accepted nor tolerated in any academic setting, this one included. Cases of plagiarism or other academic offenses will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis.
