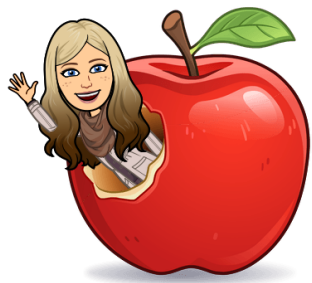
## Grading Policy

- ❖ Tests (always announced in advance)

The weight of the assignment on the final grade is based on the number of points available for a given assignment/assessment.
