This is a Regents Earth Science course. All students enrolled in this class will take the Earth Science Regents exam on **Thursday June 20th**.

## **Laboratory Requirements**

Laboratory work is critical in understanding science concepts. Therefore, prior to admission into the Regents examination, students must have successfully passed 1200 minutes of laboratory experience. **All students must take the Regents examination.** 

### **Class Overview**

In this course we will study topics such as Cartography, Geology, Meteorology, and Astronomy. We focus on the interaction of the non-living Earth "spheres", the atmosphere, the lithosphere, and hydrosphere. In addition, we will study the interaction of Earth in space.

\* We will frequently use colored pencils. While we have colored pencils to share with the class some students may prefer to bring their own.

# Quarter/Midterm/ Regents Exam description and grade weight

\*These will be subject to change based on the state and district decisions

• Marking Period: Each of the four quarters is worth 21% of your total grade.

- <u>Midterms:</u> There will be a cumulative midterm exam given at the midpoint of the year. Dates of these exams will be announced to students with sufficient time to prepare. The Midterm exam counts as 6% of your total grade
- Regents Exam: Students will take the Earth Science Regents exam in June. This will count towards 10% of your final grade.

\*Please note that if a student misses a regents, this will be factored into their final average as a zero. Students will not be given INC (Incomplete) for regents exams unless they can provide medical documentation excusing their absence.

### **Student Expectations**

- LATENESS TO CLASS IS UNACCEPTABLE WITHOUT A VALID REASON. Students who
  are continually late will receive a contact to their parents and possible
  administrative referral.
- ALL CELLPHONES will be quieted and put away, a wall pouch is provided to store student phones during class. Students should not be retrieving their cell phones to take to the bathroom with them or to wander the halls.
- Students are expected to participate in a positive and constructive manner.
- <u>Late assignments</u> will be accepted for a reduced grade at the teacher's discretion. Assignments that are reviewed in class may not be accepted for any credit.

### Labs:

- <u>Conduct</u>: Lab experiences will include safely following prescribed lab procedures and handling delicate and costly equipment. Students who fail to conduct themselves appropriately will be removed from the lab. Furthermore, a student may be held financially responsible for damage of the equipment through carelessness or misuse.
- Make-up Labs: Absences on lab days should be avoided whenever possible. If you are absent, you must make-up that lab TIME, copying someone else's data does not qualify as a lab, you must sit for the lab time. Students can come in during their lunch or study hall periods to complete or make up missed/incomplete labs. The lab manual is also available on Google Classroom, so students can complete the labs at home if needed.
- **Incomplete labs will not be accepted**. Labs should be completed at the end of each lab period. However, if a student does not finish within the lab period, they will have one complete lab cycle to turn in their labs without penalty. Unless discussed with the teacher prior, labs turned in after the end of the 4 day lab cycle will not receive a grade higher than a 50%. In order for a lab to be deemed acceptable towards the 1,200 minute requirement, a minimum score of 50% must be earned.

If you do not meet the 1,200 minute New York State requirement, you will not be
able to take the Earth Science Regents exam. You will automatically fail the course
and will not be able to attend summer school. You will have to repeat the course the
following year.

### Attendance:

Attendance is critical to a student's success. If you are absent from school, it is your responsibility to find out what you missed and make up the work. It is expected that you will make arrangements with the teacher to make up missed activities immediately upon return to school

If you are absent on the day of the test, the test will be given the next day that you are present.

Students and parents should make every effort to establish a study routine at home, as students who study regularly and complete assigned work on time are more likely to perform well on exams and experience success in school.
